FROM PASTOR ADEN'S DESK—

LOOK WITH THE EYES OF FAITH

"All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel' (which means 'God with us'). [Matthew 1:22,23]



We treasure these familiar words from the Christmas story. What joy to remember how God came down from heaven when the time had fully come and a childwas born of a virgin. The wonder continues for us each year as we marvel at the cherished details of that birth, recounting the who, where, and how God brought love down to us through the miraculous birth of his Son.

And then God who made the world, made his dwelling in the world and lived among us. Though most of the world did not recognize him, by God's grace we do. With God's help we will ponder these things again and be given at least a little understanding of God's power, wisdom, faithfulness, and love for us. The fact that "God is with us" is shown most often in his power, wisdom, faithfulness, and love.

It is rarely easy for us to see that God is with us in the midst of life. I'm sure it was not easy for Joseph and Mary to understand God's plan as they made a late pregnancy trip on foot to Bethlehem, found no room in any inn, or as the time came for the baby to be born while they stayed in a lowly stable. It's always a challenge to see the full beauty of God's plans while they are in the midst of it being carried out.

But when we keep trusting the Lord and start to look back at the details of life, some of God's power, wisdom, faithfulness, and love become apparent. Mary would ponder all those events and eventually treasure them in her heart. It would be in the details that the beauty of God's plan were found. (Isn't it why we long to hear this beautiful story each year for ourselves?) While we have not found our way through God's plan for us in 2020, I want to encourage you to keep trusting the Lord and start to look back at a few of the details.

God has been with us and has led us to a number of wonderful blessings in the last nine months. Our congregation has been blessed with a number of new members in 2020. The need to update our audio and video capabilities could no longer be ignored, and now we are able to post services each week online. We've needed to discover many other ways to do ministry and serve one another. We continue to discover more. Many of you have shared with me that you hope that some of those changes will remain, even after they are no longer mandated. God is with us and has found a way to move us forward.

We have more to go, but even now when we look with the eyes of faith, we can begin to see God's power, wisdom, faithfulness, and love. I invite you to look with faith and find the many other reasons to thank God in your life today and into the new year.

[Regularly God's people are placed in a situation to offer a gift to our congregation. A "Wish List" is often requested, so the Stewardship Committee was asked to develop and continue to update such a list. In the last nine months they evaluated the needs and wants of our congregation—particularly facility and equipment. A number of "wishes" that were on the list have already been met as mentioned above. The Council has asked that we share the list with you, so that you might pray for your church. Give us your feedback, let us know your priorities, and share your "wishes." God "is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine." (Ep 3:20) We invite you to join us to look with eyes of faith to celebrate God's power, wisdom, faithfulness, and love as He grants the blessings of his plan for SJSJ. Below are "Wish List" Items with an estimate of cost:

Contemporary Music System We have greatly improved our Audio and Video capabilities for worship! As with many upgrades, with new components, the older parts of the system show their age. The keyboard used in our Sanctuary is an example. The recording software still uses "Floppy Discs" and the monitor capability now that the sound is amplified is lacking. [estimated cost: \$9200 (or last year's model currently available for \$5800] [Additional microphones, monitor speakers, and instrumentation could also be used. Each microphone has an estimated cost of \$500, speakers and instruments vary.] (The system upgrade is a great blessing and currently functions; these are things for the wish list when those interested in supporting our worship/music ministry with a gift might ask.)

Altar Paraments Our white set of altar paraments has been feeling its age for a while. It has been stained and cleaned multiple times. Those who care for it, realize it is time to consider replacing them. [estimated cost: \$3000]

New Folding Chairs We currently have a three year plan to upgrade our folding chairs which we use for overflow seating in the Sanctuary and for occasional large services that are hosted in the Gymnasium (e.g. Children's Christmas Eve Service, All Church Sunday). Our plan is to eventually purchase 150 (50 chairs each year—we have purchased the first 48.) [estimated cost: \$85 per 4 pack]

New Church Doors We would like to replace the old church doors with glass doors that would "match" the new doors in the Commons. This would also allow us to remotely unlock the west church door from the School Office [estimated cost for two sets of doors: \$10,500] [estimated cost for locking system: \$3,000] (We are still evaluating this issue, but initial work is being done to establish cost and options.)

New Hymnal Project (Fall 2021) It has been years in the production, but a new hymnal from our Synod will be available in the Fall of 2021.

Replace <u>Hymnals</u> currently in our pews (53 pews: 320)--\$8,000*

<u>Organists</u> (Accompaniment for hymns, Psalms, Keyboard= 2 copies)--\$680

<u>Altar books</u> (Replace current resources {more available})--\$255[estimated cost: \$850]

Service Builder (For printing, licensing, & "HymnSoft")--\$900

[estimated cost: \$1825* or \$9825]

Mailboxes We would like to install wooden mail slots for each household. We regularly disseminate information to the entire congregation. This would allow us to cut down on direct mailing information. We could make offering envelopes, annual reports, etc. available to each family when they are on campus. [estimated cost: \$5,000]

Smartboards for School Technology continually needs to be updated. Our smartboards (interactive screens for projectors) are showing their age and due to be replaced. There is a school technology fund that would help with these costs, but if someone were interested in donating a smartboard we would be able to move ahead more quickly with our replacement plan. [estimated cost: \$5,000]

ChromeBooks for School As said before, technology continually needs to be updated. Our ChromeBooks are showing their age and due to be replaced as well. ChromeBooks are the one to one computers that we use in our classrooms (our students use computers in their classrooms even down to our 3K classroom). There is a school technology fund that would help with these costs, but if someone were interested in donating ChromeBook we would be able to move ahead more quickly with our replacement plan. [estimated cost: \$5,000]

New Lawnmower We have replaced our 18 year old 60" lawnmower. We're looking to cover the remaining costs. [estimated cost: \$1,100] (Cost is the remaining balance, if not met by gifts, it is anticipated it will be given by Cemetery Committee next year.)

OUR PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

This year has been very different. Our daily lives have some new things, Masks, Social Distancing and Hand Sanitizer. Things were also very different for churches in our country. We were shut down for about three months. Our church has been open since June, but things are different with social distancing and church capacity limits. Some of our members are not coming to church because of health reasons with the pandemic. Right now, I'm one of them. Because God has given us technology, we can watch the services online. We are very grateful for that. But there is a lot of good news. Our summer outdoor services were very well attended. People with health conditions even came because we weren't inside.

I don't like to talk a lot about money but I'm going to say a few words about it. During the shutdown and now with attendance being down, our members have been sending in their offerings. As a result, we are holding our own. We didn't have to borrow any money from our line of credit to cover expenses. What a wonderful blessing. We thank you very much. From a business standpoint, Our members in the past have brought very good year end offerings. As a result we have a nice checkbook balance on January 1st which helps carry us through to our Lenten Services and Easter. Despite the pandemic, we hope and pray that this will happen again this year. Just a reminder, this year we forgot to include a New Years Eve offering envelope. You can use a plain envelope or use a leftover envelope that you have and mark it NEW YEARS EVE. Enough about finances.

Christmas will be different this year. We're having four Christmas Eve services. Large family gatherings will be replaced with smaller ones. Some people have told me that it's just not going to be the same. That's true, but then on the other hand, it'll be the same and also very joyful. That's because we get to celebrate the birth of our Savior which makes Christmas very joyful no matter what the other circumstances are this year. Have a very Blessed Christmas and a Happy New Year.

NEW TAX OPPORTUNITY FOR CHURCH OFFERINGS

In 2016 the U.S. Government passed a new law. This law can help people who are 72 years or older save money on their taxes.

If you are drawing funds for your retirement from an IRA or a 401K fund, you can eliminate paying some of the federal taxes on this. If you have your church offerings taken directly from your IRA or 401K, you don't have to pay federal taxes on this distribution from your retirement funds.

If you're sending in your offering every week or even if you come to church and put in your offering envelope, we have an easier way to give your offering. It's called Automatic Withdrawal. Instead of writing a check and filling out an envelope every week, you can have your church offerings withdrawn from your checking or savings account and it will be sent directly to St. John-St. James. If you're gone for a weekend or if there's bad weather, you don't have to worry about making it up the next week. You can have withdrawals made on the 1st of the month, the 15th of the month or you can split it between the 1st and the 15th.
