

OPENING SENTENCES

- M** They carried a load of spices in the pre-dawn darkness. Yet the grief and regret they carried in their hearts far outweighed what was in their arms. The one they loved was dead. The surprise of his death and the approach of the Sabbath had cut their burial preparations short. They went to the tomb.
- C** **We too have burdens and regrets. Let us also go to the tomb!**
- M** Questions arose as they walked. Who would roll the stone away? Would guards or enemies trouble them at the tomb? How difficult would it be to perform this last act of love for their Lord? Yet they went to the tomb.
- C** **We too have questions—about life and death. Let us also to go the tomb!**
- M** The men didn't believe. There must be a mistake. It was too much to simply take the others' word for it; they had to see for themselves. Surely better conclusions and assurances would be found when they got to the tomb and could examine the evidence. In haste they went to the tomb.
- C** **We too want assurances. Let us also go to the tomb!**
- M** So then, yes, let us also go to the tomb with the first disciples. We will journey with them on the pages of Scripture. There in God's Word our Lord shows us an empty grave and the place where our burdens are lifted, regrets are removed, and our greatest questions are answered. Our journey begins in the name of the One who planned and carried out this great event of our salvation.
- C** **We begin in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.**

Each one had a harp and they were holding golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of God's people. ⁹And they sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain, and with your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation. ¹⁰You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to serve our God, and they will reign on the earth."

¹¹Then I looked and heard the voice of many angels, numbering thousands upon thousands, and ten thousand times ten thousand. They encircled the throne and the living creatures and the elders. ¹²In a loud voice they were saying: "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and praise!"

¹³Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and on the sea, and all that is in them, saying: "To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power, for ever and ever!"

¹⁴The four living creatures said, "Amen," and the elders fell down and worshiped.

Gospel Lesson

Matthew 28:1-15

28 After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb.

²There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. ⁴The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men.

⁵The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. ⁷Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you."

⁸So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

¹¹While the women were on their way, some of the guards went into the city and reported to the chief priests everything that had happened. ¹²When the chief priests had met with the elders and devised a plan, they gave the soldiers a large sum of money, ¹³telling them, "You are to say, 'His disciples came during the night and stole him away while we were asleep.' ¹⁴If this report gets to the governor, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble." ¹⁵So the soldiers took the money and did as they were instructed. And this story has been widely circulated among the Jews to this very day.



MLC/ MLHS Tuition Assistance

We've all heard about the shortage of Pastors and Teachers in our Synod. Presently we have 130 Pastor vacancies and approximately 135 Teacher vacancies. Right now the Baby Boomer generation is retiring. We don't have enough graduates to take the place of all these people.

Maya Aden, Josh Aden, Lynsey Marohn and Michaela Bubolz are attending MLC. They plan on becoming Called Workers in our Synod. This is a great blessing from our Gracious God.

As we all know, the cost of education keeps going up every year. For the 2021-2022 school year, the cost for attending MLC will be \$28,690.00. The cost over four years is over \$114,000. Approximately 75% of MLC students graduate with debt. This is a concern for our Synod.

MLC has a matching Scholarship fund. If the student's home congregation gives him or her between \$100 to \$1000, MLC will match it. Last year we gave each student \$1000 for the match. Two years ago, we gave each student \$1700 and each one got the \$1000 match.

We have some other good news this year. All six of our eighth graders are going to MLHS this fall. Right now, the majority of these students don't have a State Voucher. We will first know on June first if any of these students will receive vouchers. Tuition at MLHS is \$6000 for a year. We would also like to help them out with tuition costs.

We don't have enough earnings from our Education Fund in the Endowment Fund to support this. The Church Council has recommended that we once again have a two month special offering for this.

We have set a goal of \$8000 to provide our MLC and MLHS students with tuition assistance. We will run this special offering from March 28th to June 6th.
