Beloved in Christ: In this Christmas season it is our duty and delight to hear again the message of the angels and, in heart and mind, to go even unto Bethlehem and see this thing which has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us, the Christ-child, lying in a manger.

CONFESSION OF SINS

M As we draw near to the newborn Christ child tonight, we enter into the presence of holiness. We may be gathered around a lowly manger in the midst of the humblest of beginnings as we look through faith upon His face, but the truth remains. We are unworthy guests. We are sinners who have no right to approach the sinless Son of God. Yet His very presence in our world testifies to God's love and intention to save His people from their sins. In grace the Father sends His Son and invites us to approach. Confident in the love God has shown us through Jesus Christ, we confess our sins before God and one another.

C **Heavenly Father, we humbly bow before You on tonight filled with awe at Your great love for us. We know that we are unworthy of such love because of our sins in thought, word, and deed. Yet in the midst of our failings, You have given us the gift of Your only Son. Forgive our sin and fill us with the everlasting peace only You can give. We approach Your throne of grace in Jesus' name. Amen.**

PROCLAMATION OF FORGIVENESS

M Standing in the presence of our Holy God, I announce His peace to you! The separation between God and sinful mankind has been healed by Jesus Christ. He was born in our midst to give us Christmas peace. What joy to announce the angels' message to you: *"Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord."* His name is Jesus—He has saved His people from their sins. M Ezekiel proclaims he is the Shepherd:

C **“I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the Lord God. I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak.”**

(Ezekiel 34:5-16a)

M Micah proclaims him from Bethlehem:

C **“But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come from me, one who is from of old, from ancient times.”**

M Zechariah proclaims him the humble King:

The Epistle Lesson

Hebrews 1:1-4

1 In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, **2** but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. **3** The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. **4** So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs.

The Gospel Lesson

John 1:1-14

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. **2** He was with God in the beginning. **3** Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. **4** In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. **5** The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

6 There was a man sent from God whose name was John. **7** He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. **8** He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

9 The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. **10** He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. **11** He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. **12** Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God— **13** children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Galatians 4:1-7

God Gave Us His Bundle of Joy

4 What I am saying is that as long as an heir is underage, he is no different from a slave, although he owns the whole estate. **2** The heir is subject to guardians and trustees until the time set by his father. **3** So also, when we were underage, we were in slavery under the elemental spiritual forces of the world. **4** But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, **5** to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship. **6** Because you are his sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, "Abba, Father." **7** So you are no longer a slave, but God's child; and since you are his child, God has made you also an heir.
