## FROM PASTOR'S DESK



HE 13:1 Keep on loving one another as brothers and sisters. <sup>2</sup> Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.

In Genesis 18 God tells us the story Abraham showing generous hospitality to three strangers. Eventually it is revealed that they were actually angels. In the process Abraham experiences great joy and long-lasting blessings through their visit with him and Sarah. I encourage you to reread the story.

The passage above seems to have Abraham in mind. The passage is unclear about whether you will ever show hospitality to a stranger and have it turn out that you showed hospitality to an angel. It does tell that it has happened to some people. What is clear is that God does want us to love one another and specifically tells us one way he wants us to show that love. He says, "**Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers**."

In our A God-Lived Life sermon series we explored what showing hospitality means. It most certainly is what the passage from Hebrews speaks about—showing love to another. But it is more. It is not just doing things for others but opening our lives to others. God encourages us to bring people into our lives and "invest" in them. God wants us to spend time with others and get to know them. He asks us to offer one of our most valuable commodities—time.

God's intent is fairly simple. He wants us to spend time and energy on our relationships with others (and with God himself, of course). Building relationships with others is how we show love to others. It's also the way God intends us to find opportunities to show them even greater love by sharing the love of Jesus with them. Relationships is how God has always intended his Kingdom to grow. One person living their faith and sharing their faith with another.

Not surprisingly then, God tells us: "Keep on loving one another as brothers and sisters. Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers." We do that with common sense, caution, and confidence knowing that God can use the love and kindness we show to others as a bridge for others to experience and know God's love through us. It's unclear if a stranger will ever be an angel, but it is clear that God wants us to show hospitality and he'll bring blessings when we do.

May God bless us this month as we challenge each other to show hospitality. Please take a look at the challenge cards included with this newsletter. Talk about them with your family or friends and challenge yourself to at least one way you'll love others by showing hospitality. In June we'll have another opportunity in worship to bring our filled in challenge cards and try a new challenge if you'd like (Maybe you'd like to try one challenge in May and a different challenge in June. If you do, bring two completed challenge cards.) We'd love to hear how you are challenging yourself and to pray for blessings in what you're doing to serve the Lord. May God bless your hospitality as you love another.

### St. John-St. James School 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

One generation commends Your works to another; they tell of Your mighty acts. Psalm 145: 4

This is our Anniversary theme. Our Anniversary will start with the 2024-2025 school year.

We have several events planned.

- 1. Our kickoff will begin with the opening service for our school year on Sunday, August 18th. There will be a meal. The children's games will be games that the children played in 1874. More details to follow.
- 2. The MLC choir will present a concert in our church on Saturday, October 12th at 7:00 P.M.
- 3. All church Sunday will be held on November 10<sup>th</sup>. This service will focus on our Anniversary. Following this service, pie and ice cream will be served which was an old German tradition in our church.
- 4. December 8<sup>th</sup> will be MLHS Sunday. December 8th is also the 167<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our first church service in 1857.

- 6. Our school was founded by Pastor Albert Kluge. Pastor Kluge served our congregation from 1866-1880. In 1867 the congregation decided to start a school fund. Each member was requested to contribute 25 cents for the acquisition of school equipment. In 1867, 25 cents was a lot.
- 7. The Anniversary Committee has decided to have a quarter war to commemorate this offering. We are asking alumni to participate in this offering also. We are going to have 4 jars numbered with 4 different age groups.
- 8. The funds from this quarter war will be put in the Building Fund. If you have any questions, please contact a committee member.
- 9. We will also be selling Anniversary T-shirts, sweatshirts and an Anniversary memento which will be a Christmas ornament. More details on this will be coming.

#### MLC/MLHS Scholarship Fund

We've all heard about the shortage of Pastors and Teachers in our synod. Presently, we have about 160 pastor vacancies and approximately 243 teacher vacancies. Right now the baby boomer generation is retiring. We don't have enough graduates to take the place of these people.



Josh Aden is finishing his emergency call at the end of this school year and will be retuning to MLC this fall to finish his final year. The cost of attending MLC for one year is \$30,095. Approximately 75% of our students graduate with debt. This is a concern for our synod.

MLC has a matching Scholarship Fund. If the student's home congregation gives him or her between \$100 to \$1450, MLC will match it. We thank you for your generous contributions.

We put away \$3200 for Josh because he didn't have to use it this year with his emergency call. We want to keep the MLC Scholarship Fund going because it looks like we'll have some more students at MLC in the future.

This year we want to set a goal of \$2000 for the MLC Scholarship Fund for the 2024-2025 school year.

This next school year we will have seven students attending Manitowoc Lutheran High School who would benefit from financial assistance. Tuition at MLHS is \$7400. We are setting a goal of \$14,000 for the MLHS Scholarship Fund which is \$2000 per student.

We will run this special offering from Easter Sunday, March 31st to June 2nd . You can designate which fund you'd like to contribute to. If you wish to make a contribution, mark your envelope either MLC Scholarship Fund or MLHS Scholarship Fund. If you don't designate which fund, it will be split between the two funds. Please make your checks out to St. John-St. James. We cannot cash checks made out to MLC or MLHS. 
