FROM PASTOR'S DESK



The Priest and the Levite probably had good and legitimate reasons for what they did. They had busy lives, busy schedules, responsibilities to fulfill and expectations that needed their attention. Maybe they thought they should do something. Maybe they planned to come back later. We don't know. We aren't told their inner-dialogue or thoughts as they walk past that mess of a man on the side of the road.

The Samaritan very likely was busy too. It's not hard to imagine he too had a full schedule with his own responsibilities and expectations to fulfill. But when he saw the man, his heart went out to him. He had pity on him. He loved him. And so, he went out of his way for him. He put the poor beat up man first so that he would have the love, the care, the support he needs. He went above and beyond what someone would expect, not because he is trying to impress anyone. He's not looking for any awards or pats on the back. He's not looking at himself. He was really present in this man's life. He sees his neighbor and loves him.

Jesus tells us: "Go and do likewise," (Luke 10:37).

I'm not the Good Samaritan and neither are you. Jesus is. We are that man on the side of the road beat up by Satan's accusations, born dead in sin, left with the stench of death hanging over our heads. We are naked before God without any excuse for the bad we have done and the good we have failed to do!

But here comes Jesus. He does not pass us by but is really present for us! He should have nothing to do with me. Instead, he takes time for me, has compassion on me, is not disgusted by the state I am in by nature. He loves me! So, he takes away the sin, the accusations, cleanses me with his blood to wipe away the stench of death, and promises that I have place waiting that is already mine with him.

And having seen what Jesus does for me, now I can see my neighbor, really see them. He's someone Jesus died for too! She's someone who needs Christ's love in her life. That is, your literal neighbor across the road. Your child playing outside. Your brother, sister, friend. That stranger serving in the restaurant. Especially the one who makes your life difficult. And Jesus chooses to use **us** to give **them** the love and care that **they** need! And we want to because that's how Jesus has loved us! Knowing that Jesus has already taken care of everything for me, gives my daily bread and all I need for body and life including the love and care I need, knowing that he has already secured my place with him, I'm set free to love and serve my neighbor, to, "Go and do likewise."

The next challenge in our God-Live Life series is, "A Life Lived for Others." This challenge is all about taking those opportunities to be really present in someone's life. It's about going outside of our comfort zones. It's about going and doing as Jesus loved us.

MLC/MLHS Scholarship

- 1. This year we received \$2626.00 for the MLC Scholarship fund.
- 2. Because Josh Aden accepted an emergency call this past school year, he didn't need any tuition assistance last school year.
- SCHOLARSHIPS
- 3. We kept the \$3220.00 for him to be used this year.
- 4. The Planned Giving Committee decided to give Josh \$4550.00 for his tuition assistance this year and we'll keep \$1296.00 in the fund for future MLC students from our congregation.
- 5. We received \$10,105.00 for the MLHS Scholarship fund.
- 6. Because we were ahead in the Education fund in the Endowment fund, we took out \$395.00 to make the amount \$10,500.00.
- 7. We stated in the bulletin that 7 MLHS students would benefit from tuition assistance. We just found out from MLHS when we took the funds there that one of the students received a School Choice voucher this past year.
- 8. We now have 6 students who could use tuition assistance.
- 9. Each student will receive \$1750.00 tuition assistance.
- 10. Thank you to everyone for your generous offerings and support for Christian Education for for these students.


