CRAVE THE FOOD OF GOD'S WORD

^{1 Peter 1:23} For you have been born again, not of perishable seed, but of imperishable, through the living and enduring word of God. ²⁴ For, "All people are like grass, and all their glory is like the flowers of the field; the grass withers and the flowers fall, ²⁵ but the word of the Lord endures forever." And this is the word that was preached to you.

^{2:1} Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. ² Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, ³ now that you have tasted that the Lord is good.

Food is good, right? Who doesn't like food? Don't we all have some food that they like to eat? Why do we like to eat? There are a lot of reasons, right? First, you need food so you can live, so you can grow strong, so you can have energy to do what you need to do. And then, it tastes good, too, doesn't it? And eating it is a way to show love and appreciation for the person who made it for you. There are lots of good reasons to eat.

Now, I want you to think about your *favorite* food. (What's your favorite food?) Now, imagine you were really hungry, you hadn't eaten all day, and I gave you that food that you are thinking of. Imagine I let you take your first bite, and as soon as you realized how delicious it was and how it was going to help you not be so hungry, I took it away. How would you feel?

OK-that's the picture God's Word uses in our reading from 1 Peter. He says that his Word is like that favorite food for your faith. It tastes good-because it tells you how much God loves you. And it is just as important as food is for your body-because the Word is what builds your faith so it doesn't starve. God wants us to want his Word as much as we want that favorite food. He wants us to ask for extra helpings. This food is found at church, at Sunday School, and anywhere we hear God's Word.

This month in our challenges to live a God-lived life, we are focusing on being a disciple, a learner, one who grows in God's Word. The more we listen to and enjoy God's Word, the more God's Word causes us to crave that pure spiritual milk. It is that spiritual milk, the Word of God, that helps us to grow in our faith so that by it we grow up in our salvation. Our challenge this month will be to use God's Word in our lives even more.

Our challenge card this month offers different ways of <u>growing and learning in God's Word.</u> Here are a few questions to consider as you strive to add more of God's Word into your life: What's your biggest motivation for spending time in God's Word? What's your biggest obstacle to spending time in God's Word? What can help you overcome that obstacle? How can you build Bible study and prayer time into your regular routine? (I've also included in the newsletter this month another resource called "My Personal Devotional Plan." It has more questions and ideas to help you be successful in keeping God's Word more a part of your daily life. Please consider using it as you commit yourself to a challenge this month.)

Please take a look at the challenge cards included with this newsletter. Talk about them with your family or friends and challenge yourself to at least one way you'll add more of God's Word to life. (One last idea—I wrote the first half of this devotion in the style of a children's devotion. Perhaps you could use it as a family devotion and discuss as a family how each of you would like to challenge one another and fill out individual challenge cards—adults and children. We'll have more for you at church if you need them.) In October we'll have another opportunity in worship to bring our filled in challenge cards and try a new challenge if you'd like (Maybe you'd like to try one challenge in September and a different challenge in October. If you do, bring two completed challenge cards.) We'd love to hear how you're challenging yourself and to pray for blessings in what you're doing to serve the Lord. May God bless the coming weeks as we commit to living a God-lived life of discipleship!

My Personal Devotional Plan

- 1. Whom might I ask to be my personal Barnabas to be God's gift to help me put this plan into action and begin again (and improve the plan!) when I struggle?
- 2. What will help me make sure I am pursuing time in Word and prayer not as a "to do" done for God's benefit, but as a gift it is from my gracious God?
- 3. As you consider plans for time in Word and prayer, be sure to consider these specific questions:
 - What is the best time of the day for me to make this a regular part of my day?
 - How much time will I set aside?
 - What will come out of my schedule to make room for this?
 - · Where will I spend this time so as to avoid as many distractions as possible?
 - How can I reduce distractions from other duties and tasks in my many callings in life?
- 4. What way will I seek to slow down and meditate on what I am reading?
- 5. What books or other materials do I want to use during my devotional time?
- 6. If I plan to study Scripture "directly," how will I determine what to read and how much to read?
- 7. How can I make prayer a more vital part of my devotional time?
- 8. If I intend to develop a plan for expanding intercessory prayer, how will I structure that?
- What else could be a blessing to my time in Word and prayer? (Use of hymns, devotional books, etc.)

Presidents Newsletter Report August 2024

- **1. Kelly Loberger** was installed as our teacher during the worship service on August 18th. We are excited to have Kelly on our staff to help with teaching our children in the way of our LORD. Welcome Kelly!
- **2. Custodian position filled Dan Vogel** has been hired as our custodian and will take over school custodial responsibilities. Please welcome Dan to our team!
- **3. Church Directory** –Harman Studios will launch our Church/School Directory Event. The date for directory photo shoots will be November 1-2 & 12-14. We will be tying in the 150th anniversary with the directory highlighting the school's history. A committee has been formed to assist with the event. Look for more information soon.
- **4. School roof repairs** There is a soft spot on the older section of the school roof and Jason has been getting estimates on the cost to repair it. We will need to identify funding to address this project before winter sets in.
- 5. Budget deficit support—Thank you to everyone who supported the budget deficit we had this summer. We were blessed with enough support to pay back the \$26,000 borrowed from the charities fund with ~\$4,000 to spare which we will leave in the charities fund for future budget support. The Stewardship committee plans to have a capital campaign next spring to build up our ministry reserve fund for potential needs again next summer.
- **6. Woods management** I met with Michael Nate, Administrator for the Reedsville School District, to discuss the dead trees in the woods that run though our property and their school property. They are looking at having them removed and offered to have our woods cleared at the same time. It would involve access through the back of our property. It would not cost us anything and we could even get paid for the wood depending on the quality of it.
- **7. Annual Voter's meeting** The date has been set for September 22nd between services. Annual reports will be available prior to the meeting.


